1. Review FY22 Priorities for Community Partnership Agreements

a. FY22 NOFA - Purpose of CPA funds

The primary purpose of the funding is to provide resources at the local level to strengthen community-based services to children, youth, and families with a focus on increasing childhood well-being, with intentional efforts to address childhood trauma and Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs), as well as race equity.

- b. FY22 NOFA Funding Opportunity Description
 - The Children's Cabinet has adopted three overall themes that support its collective work as supported by this NOFA: race equity; Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) and trauma-informed practices; and research-based practices. These themes or "lenses" should be applied to all programs/strategies proposed for FY22 as follows:
 - 1. Race Equity All programs/strategies must incorporate intentional efforts to address race equity issues, including:
 - a. The strategies that the applicant will incorporate to reduce/eliminate race equity issues within b. How the applicant's race/equity efforts will support and inform planning, assessment, implementation and evaluation of the program; and,
 - c. A discussion of the most recent local race equity data with citations.

- 1. Committee members reviewed the FY22 priorities on race equity established by the state for Community Partnership Agreement funds.
- 2. Nancy reviewed the FY21 Performance Measures for the Conversation on Race program:
 - a. Between the Conversations on Race and trainings, 103 unique individuals participated.
 - Survey responses of 95% and above on the survey questions:
 Comfortable participating, engaged in dialogue, improved cultural awareness, and better able to identify institutional racism.
- 3. Committee members discussed FY22 Conversation on Race plans as outlined in TFN's FY22 NOFA application.
 - a. All members asked to assist in recruiting additional facilitators to support expansion of Conversations on Race to other audiences (e.g. families, youth, book groups).
 - b. Nancy will look at calendar to plan dates for FY22 trainings as per our NOFA application including options with Racial Equity Institute for the Intro, Phase 1 and Phase 2 sessions.
 - c. Nancy will gather information for nonprofit /agency survey and for mini-grant offering to expand our facilitated Conversations to include youth through local agency partners.
