Board Chair Katie Dilley called the meeting to order at 2:30pm.

Presentation by William Jernigan, Director of Prevention Strategies and Maryland's Statewide RED Coordinator, Governor's Office of Crime Prevention, Youth, and Victim Services. He spoke about his role within Governor's Office of Crime Prevention, Youth, and Victims' Services and his interest in supporting community-based work including through partnerships with LMBs.

Dawn Phillips from Neighborhood Service Center gave a presentation on Career Pathways which NSC began administering for TFN as of November 1, 2021. They aim to serve at least 13 disconnected youth in FY22.

Minutes from November 2021 meeting were approved as distributed.

Jazmine Paxon gave an update from the Race Equity Committee following their October 2021 meetings.

- Conversations on Race continues. The December session was in-person with 23 attendees. Next session January 27, 2022. The Equity Book Club with Talbot County Free Library had its first session this month virtually with 22 participants. Over 48 community members have registered for this program.
- The committee went into closed session at its December 9th meeting to
 - Review the application for the Youth Conversations on Race MiniGrant. A full award was approved to The Race Thing.
 - Review vendor quotes for race equity audits. From the three responses received, the committee accepted the quote from Dr. Mercedes Avila.
- Training dates have been set for the Introduction and Phase 1 trainings with the Racial Equity Institute.
 - Nancy Andrew shared that she was notified by REI that they are not scheduling Phase 2
 workshops until 2023. She has reminded the company of our contract which includes this third
 training event prior to June 2022.
 - Nancy shared that some people have registered for the REI workshops without giving their names. Following discussion, there was agreement that this is an expectation for participation in TFN workshops both virtually and in person in order to promote a positive and safe learning environment. At Corey's suggestion, Nancy will discuss this expectation with Patrick Thomas. Meanwhile, she will update the TFN Workshop Ground Rules and Norms to clarify this issue.
- Following the Request for Proposals last fall to identify a racial equity trainer, committee members are meeting with some of the vendors who responded to see if there are future opportunities for partnership.
- The Equity Grants for Talbot Organizations and Agencies call for applications was issued in January. Committee members will review applications at their February meeting.
 - Nancy reported that she has heard from at least 13 organizations expressing an interest in applying. Many have equity intentions but have not identified vendors and costs.

Nancy Andrew made a presentation on TFN funded programs using Scorecard / Performance Measure data that is tracked and reported by each vendor. The presentation concluded with a discussion of current needs and gaps for children, youth, and families. Mental health challenges was named a top concern.
