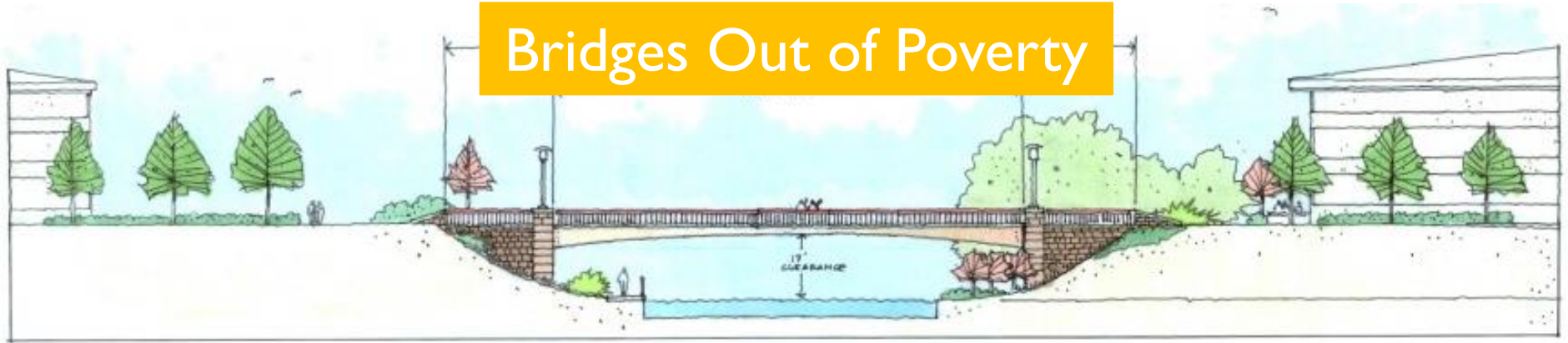

# TALBOT FAMILY NETWORK

## FY22 PROGRAMS



### CAREER PATHWAYS

*Neighborhood Service Center*

Employment skills training, service referrals, and job coaching to re-engage youth ages 16-24 who are disconnected from work and school.

### CONVERSATIONS ON RACE

*Talbot Family Network*

Facilitated conversations, workshops, and resources for community members and organizations to apply an equity lens in their work and address systemic inequities.



### COMMUNITY POVERTY EDUCATION & GETTING AHEAD

*Talbot Family Network and Talbot County Department of Social Services*  
Educational Bridges Out of Poverty workshops for the community, and practical Getting Ahead multi-week training sessions about poverty and methods of moving out of poverty.

### HEALTHY FAMILIES

*Talbot County Health Department*

An evidence-based prenatal through age 5 home visiting program for high-risk families that supports the development of healthy, stable, economically self-sufficient parents.



### HEALTHY HABITS

*Chesapeake Multi-Cultural Resource Center*

An after school hunger and nutrition education program targeting Free and Reduced Meal qualifying students at Easton Elementary School.

### REENGAGEMENT COORDINATOR

*Talbot County Public Schools*

Outreach to youth ages 16-24 who have dropped out of school within the last 7 years for reconnection to school and/or work.



### LOCAL CARE TEAM

A family-friendly resource team of Talbot County agencies to assist families with children facing behavioral, school, mental health, or physical challenges.

### HEALTHY TALBOT

An on-line and print directory connecting Talbot County families with local events, programs, and resources.

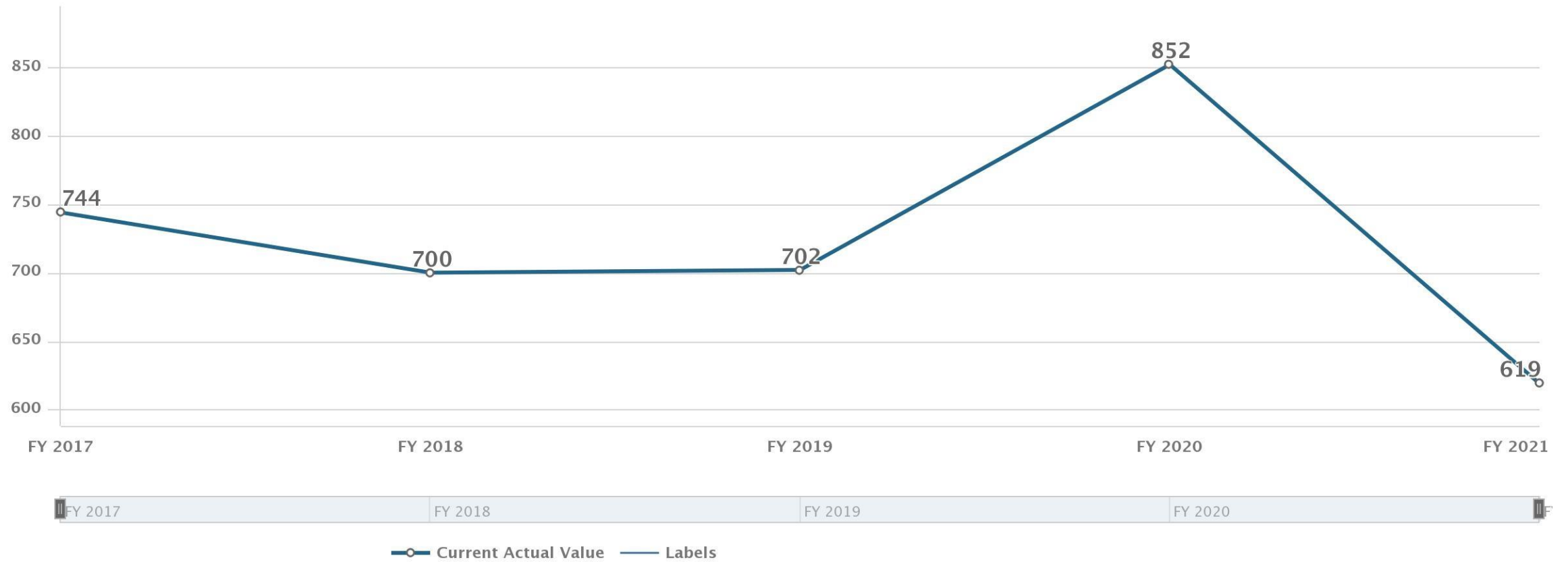

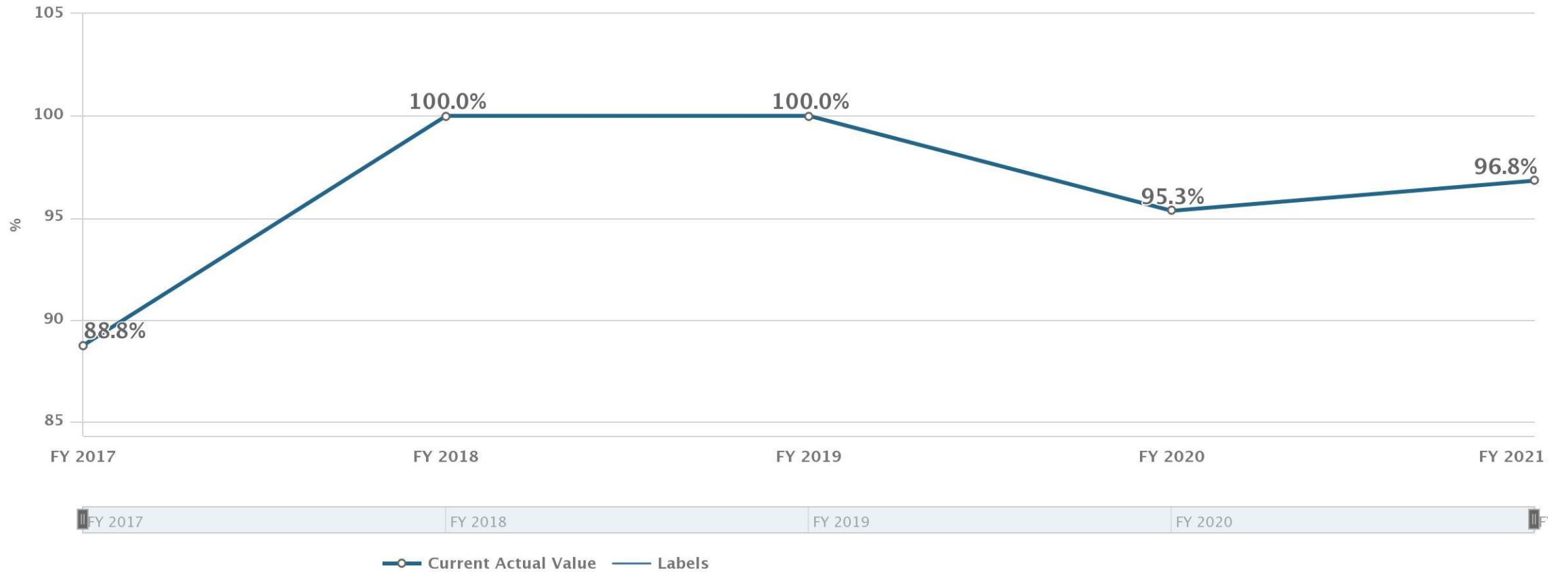

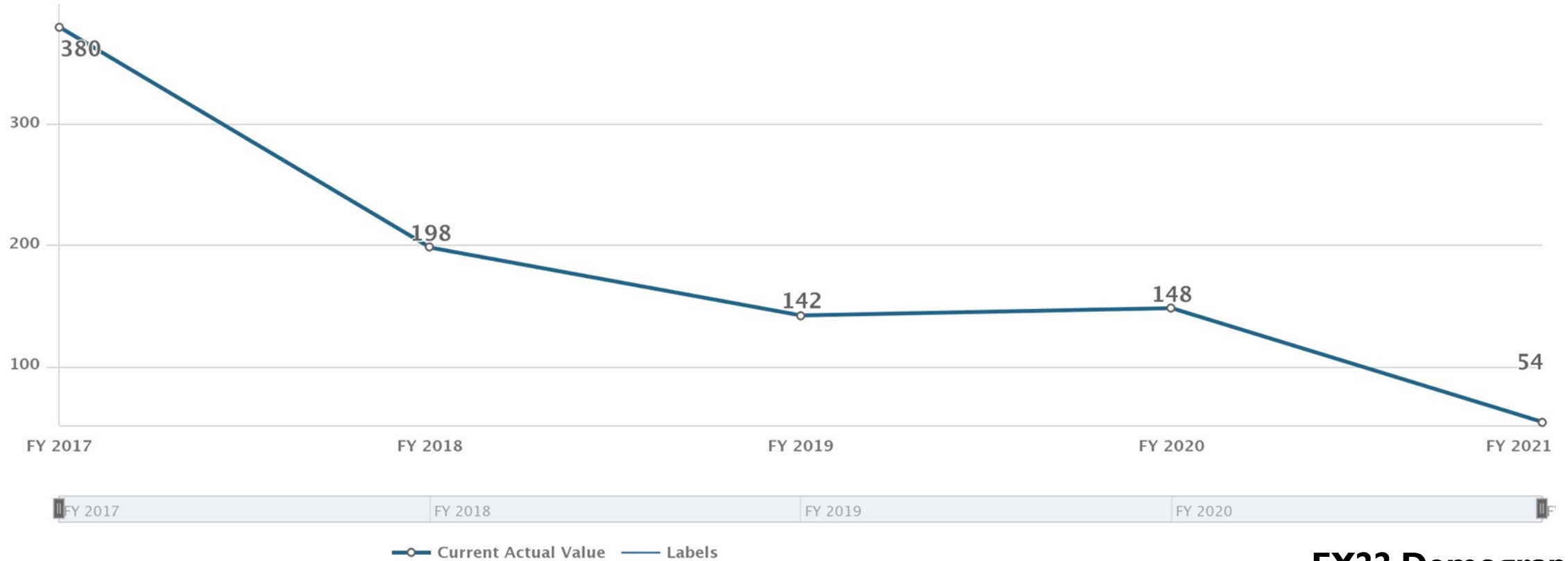

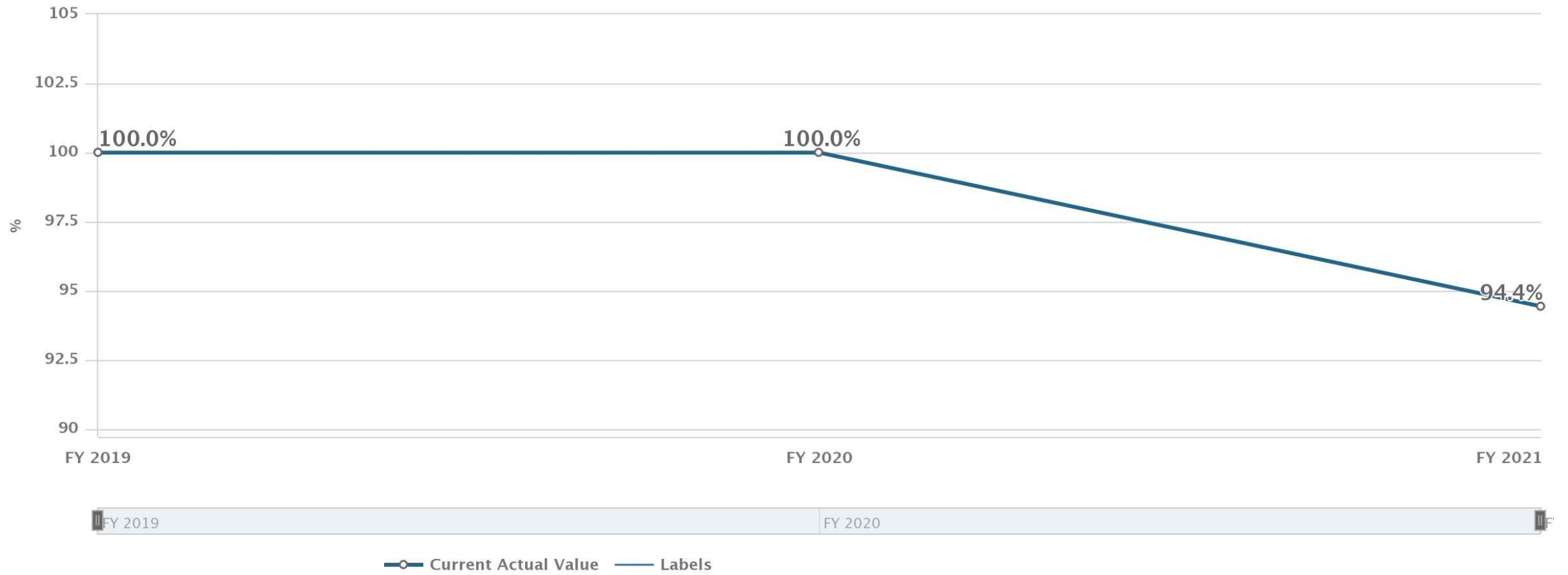

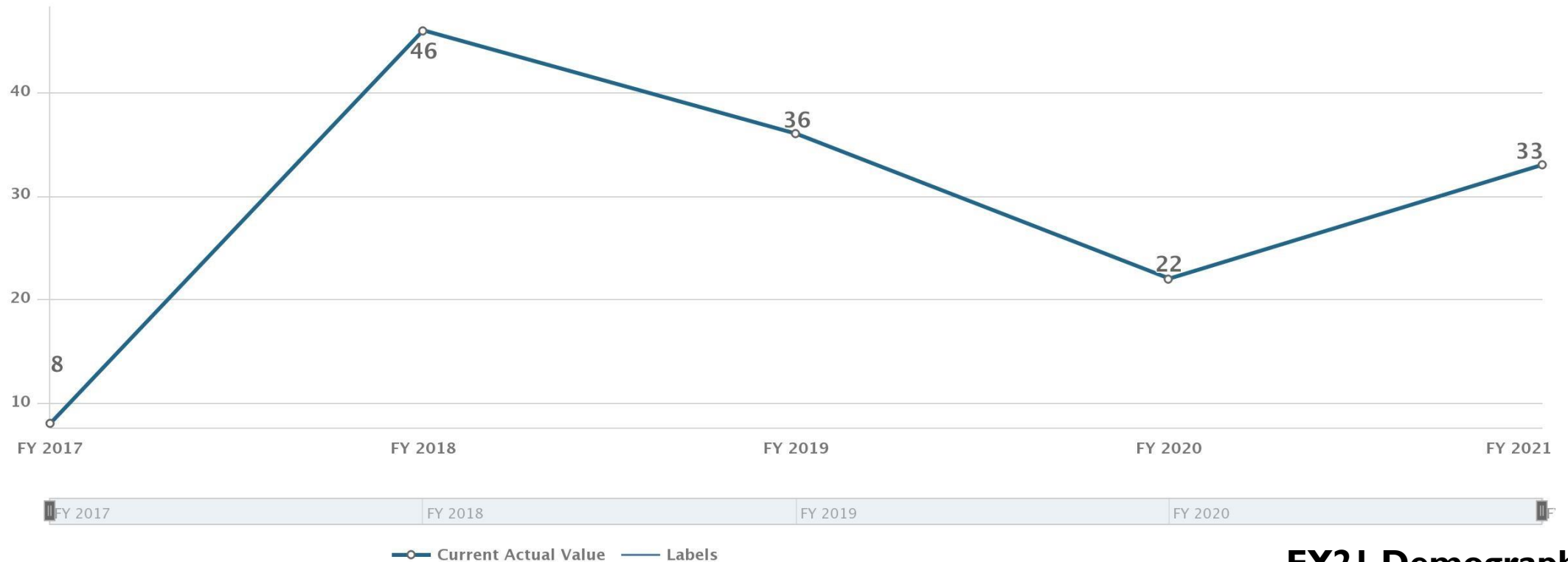

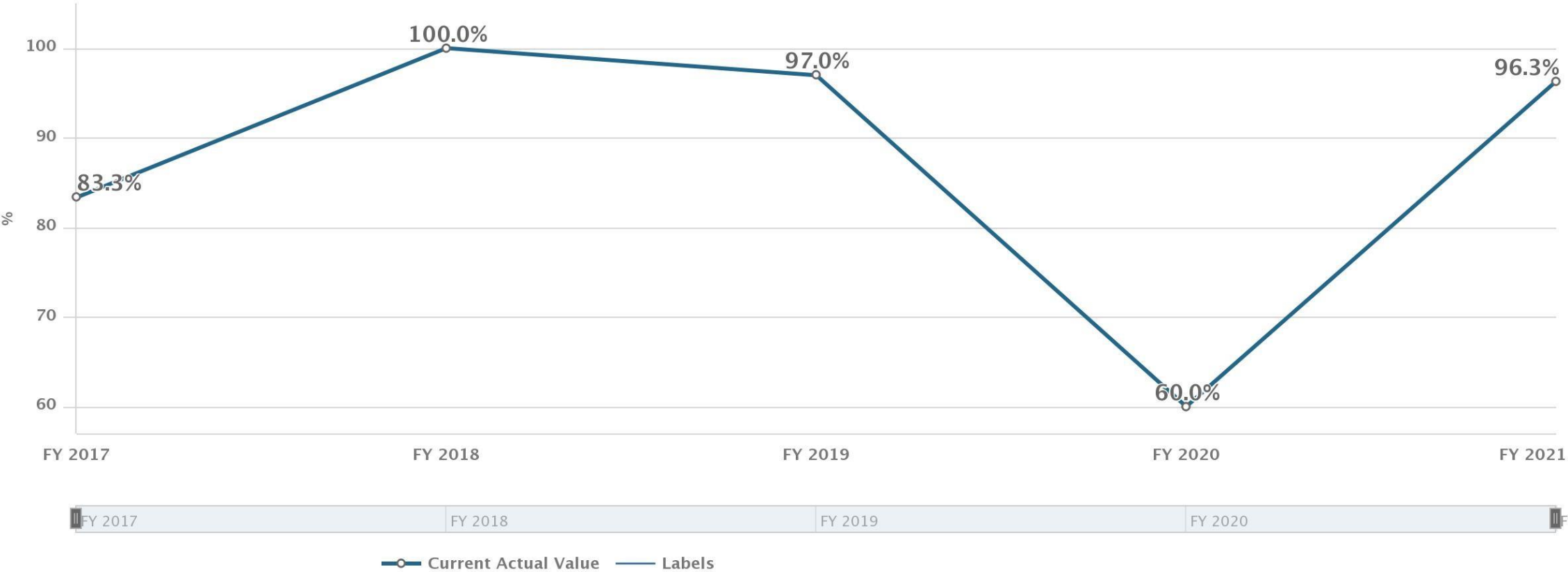
How Much: # of participants who are attending the “Getting Ahead” Workshops - Annual

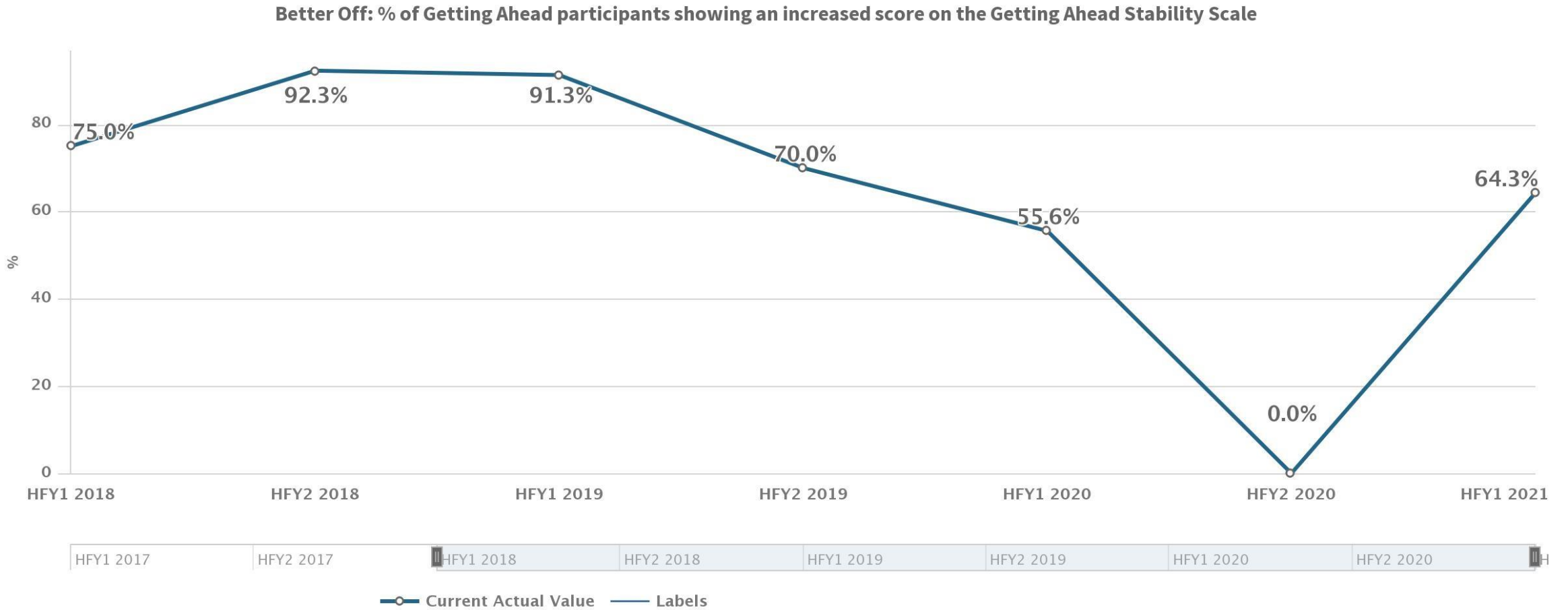

How Well: % of Getting Ahead participants reporting they feel respected and valued. - Annual





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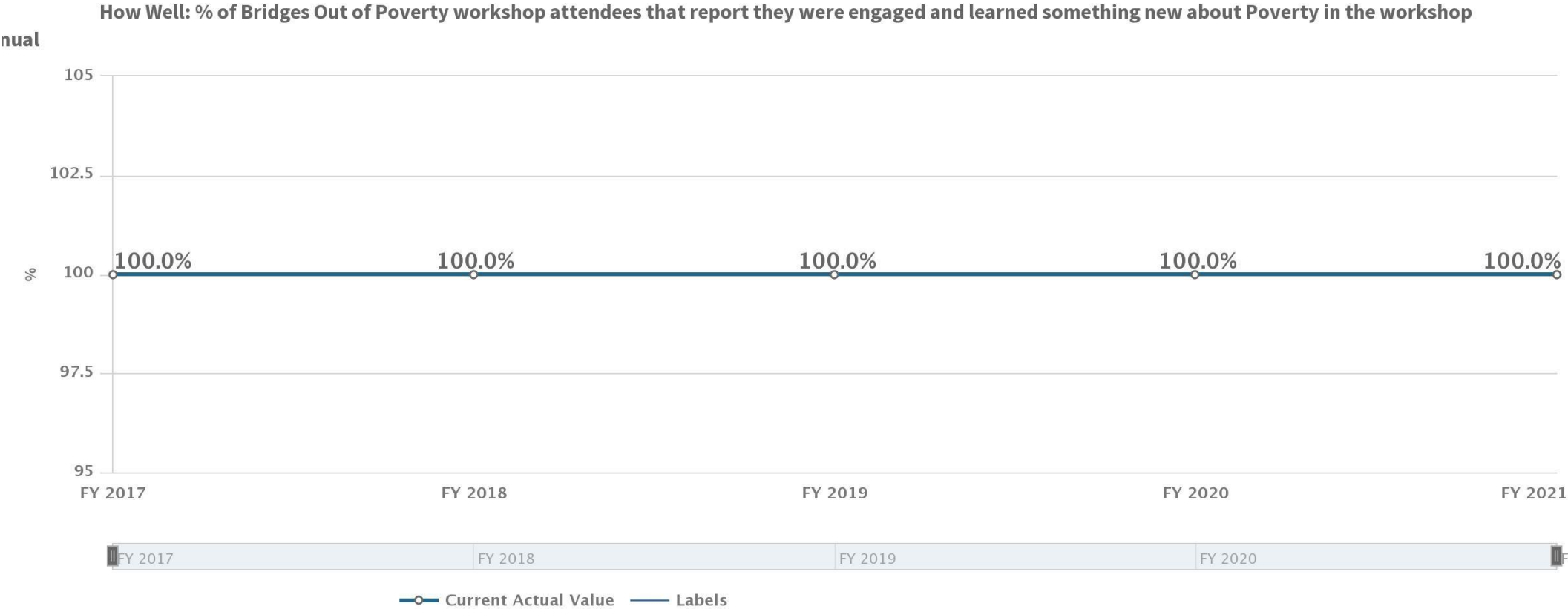

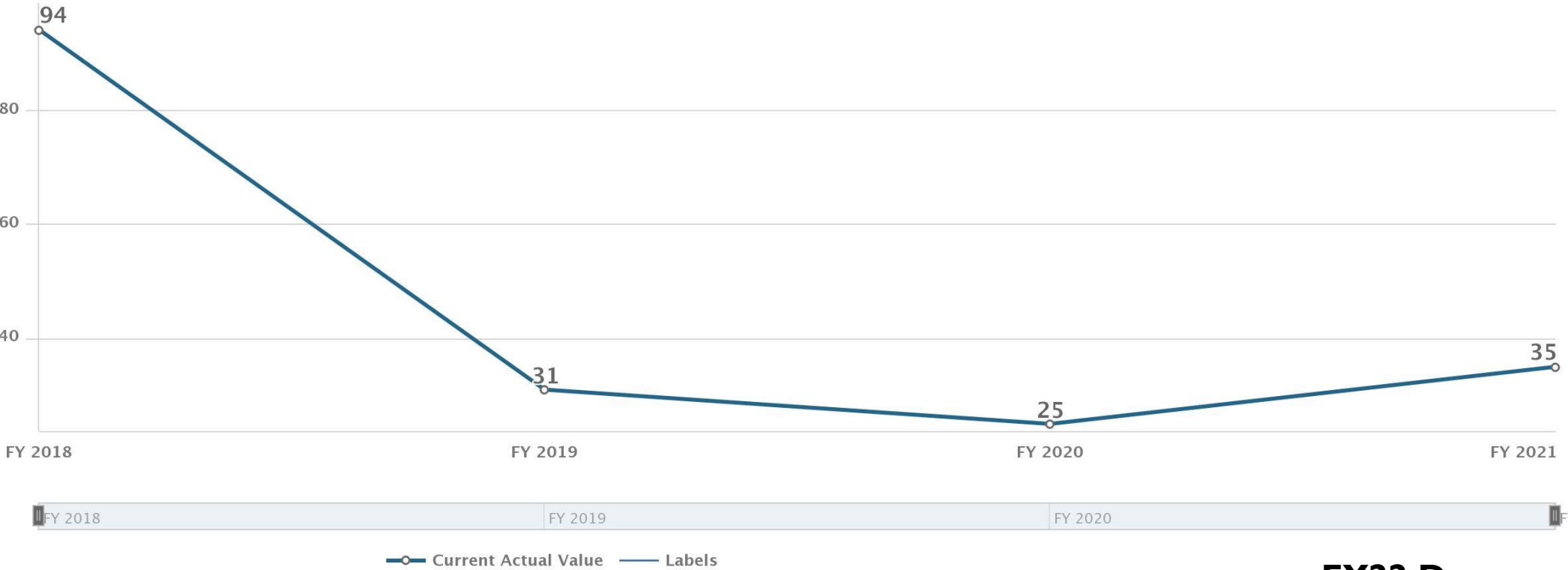

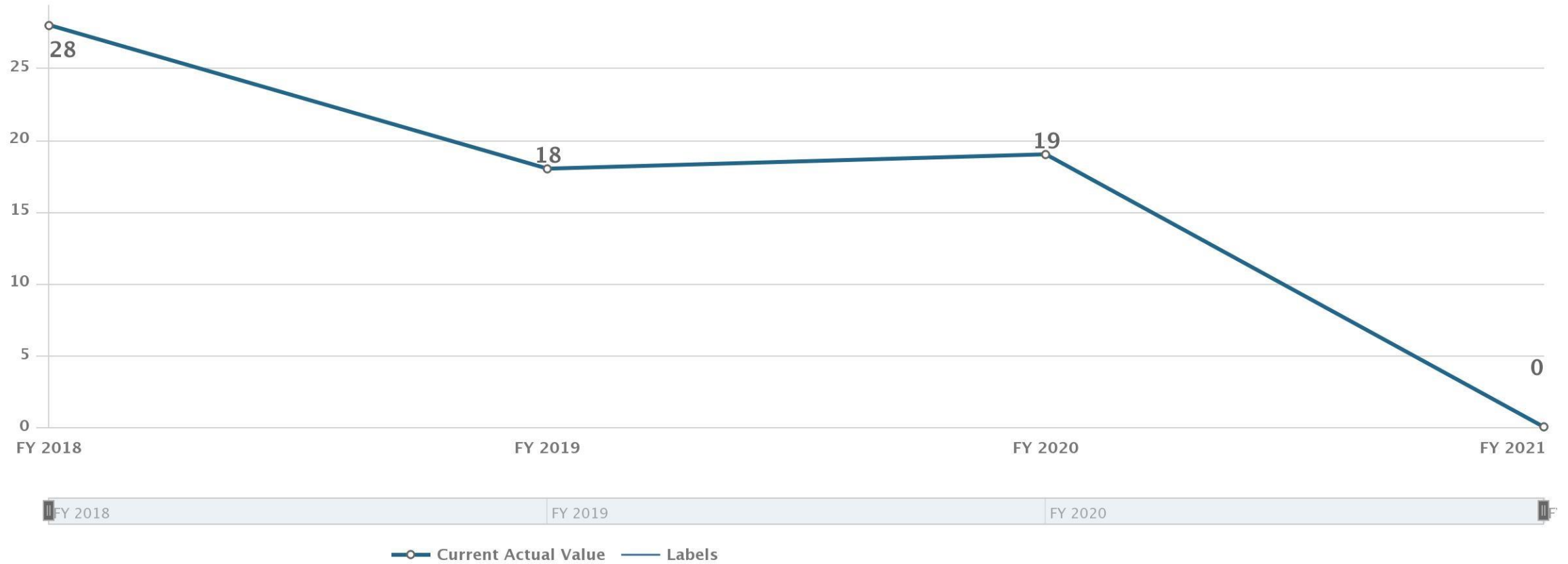
How Much: # of unduplicated Talbot disconnected youth (ages 16-24 not in school or working) served by the Reengagement Coordinator - Annual



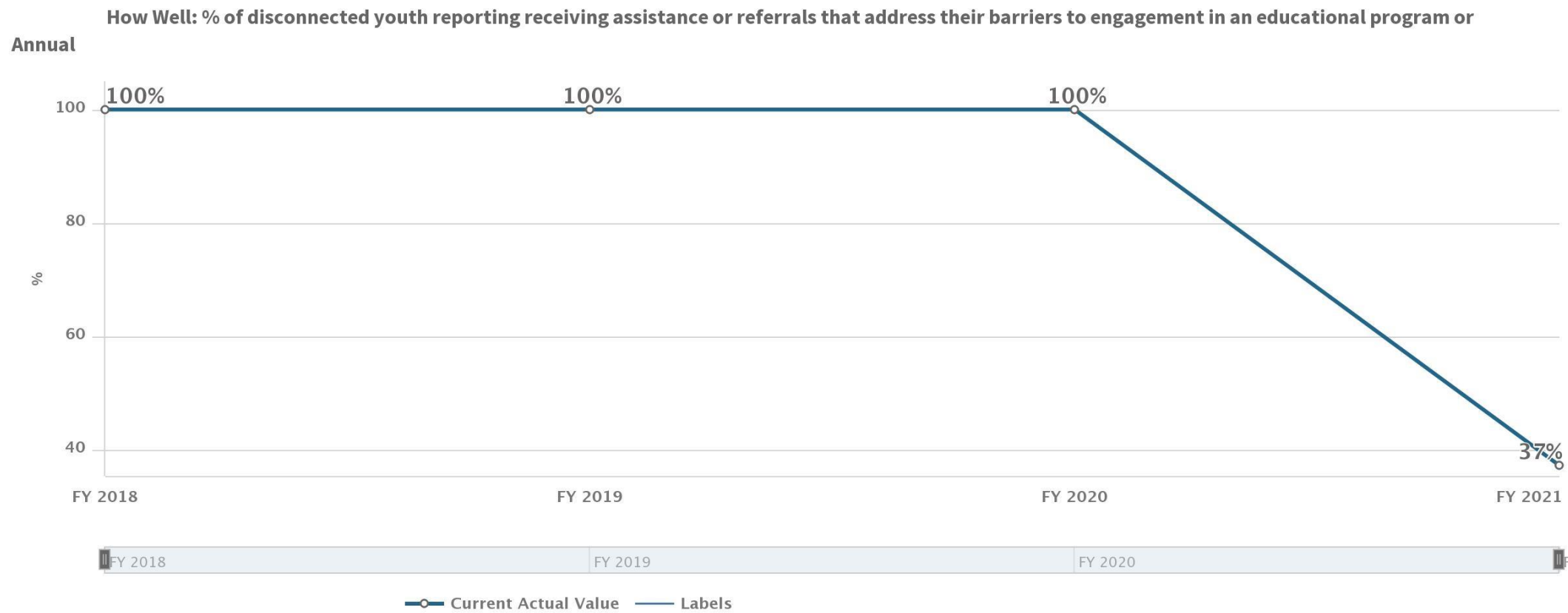

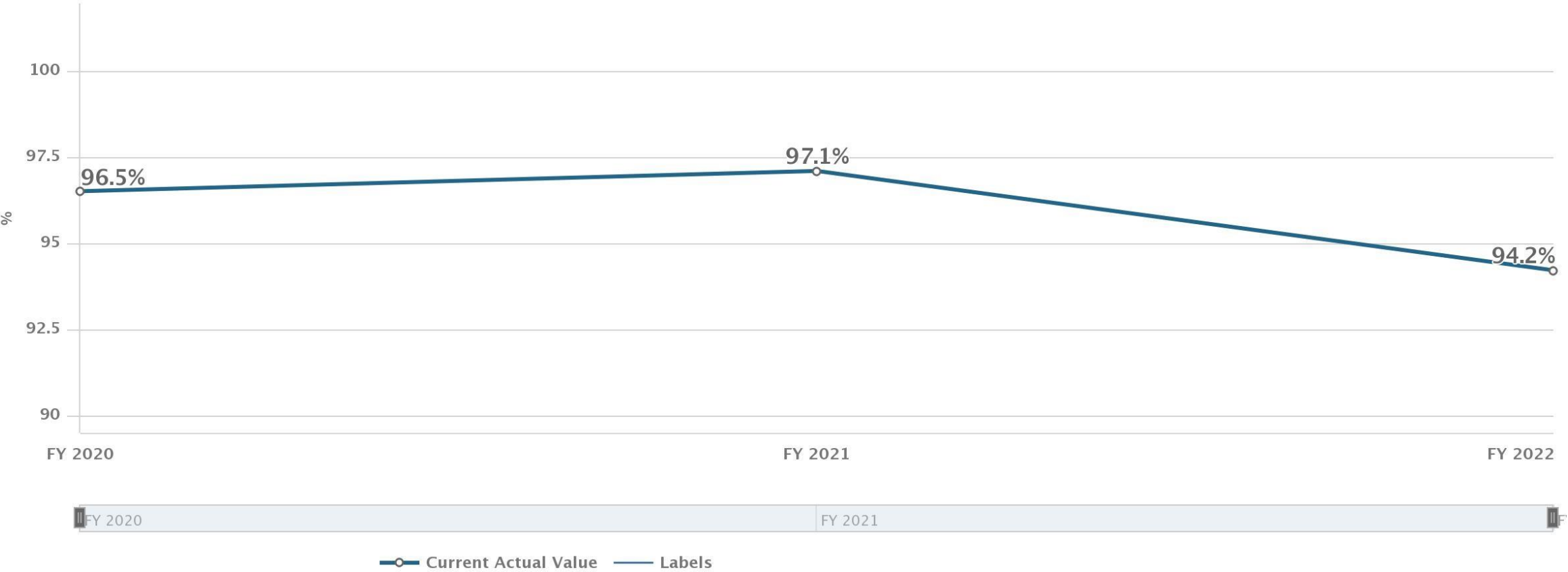
How Much: # of participants in Beyond Diversity training and Racial Equity Community of Practice - Annual
