



How Much: # of unduplicated participants with signed HF enrollment agreement - Annual


















How Well: % of Getting Ahead participants reporting they feel respected and valued. - Annual



Better Off: % of Getting Ahead participants showing an increased score on the Getting Ahead Stability Scale














