LOCAL MANAGEMENT BOARD FUNDED PROGRAMS - FY23

The Talbot Family Network (TFN) [Board of Directors](#) approved funding for these programs for Fiscal Year 2023. As the county's [Local Management Board](#), TFN administers funding from the Community Partnership Agreement of the [Maryland Children's Cabinet](#).

This funding is targeted at providing local resources for strengthening community-based services to children, youth, and families with a focus on increasing childhood well-being, and with intentional efforts to address childhood trauma and Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs), as well as racial and ethnic disparities. Each program responds to one or more of the Governor's [Child Well-Being Results](#).

The LMB Board of Directors review local data and collect public input through community assessments to identify local needs, gaps and priorities. From this process, funding strategies are determined. Program vendors are selected through a bid process as per county policy.

Afterschool Programming

BAAM, Neighborhood Service Center, Tilghman Area Youth Association

Safe and supportive out of school programs providing academic enrichment, recreation, and project-based learning. Funded by supplemental dollars from the State Students, this programming addresses the physical, social and emotional disruption brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic. Students need expanded support to emerge from the pandemic strong, resilient, and hopeful.

Career Pathways re-engages youth ages 16-24 who are disconnected from work and school in pre-employment instruction, training referrals, linkages to services, and job coaching.

This program integrates a Community of Practice strategy with training and tools aimed at building the capacity of community members, leaders, and organizations as equity practitioners. Through this program, we engage participants along a continuum of readiness helping people and groups move through the stages of awareness, acceptance, accountability, alignment, and action.

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Healthy Families

Healthy Families is a prenatal through age 5 home visiting program for high-risk families that supports the development of healthy, stable, economically self-sufficient parents by capitalizing on the worker/parent relationship and leveraging this trust to engage the mothers in self-development and behavior change. The Healthy Families model is a leading family support and evidence-based home visiting program in the U.S.

Healthy Habits

Chesapeake Multicultural Resource Center

Healthy Habits is an after school hunger and nutrition education program targeting Free and Reduced Meal qualifying students at Easton Elementary School with research-based nutrition education and after school meals.

Mental Health Programming

BAAM, Channel Marker, For All Seasons

School and community-based mental health programming to promote mental and emotional well-being for children and youth, families. BAAM is leading a physical and mental health support program for youth and families in partnership with Talbot Mentors, Mid Shore Mediation, and Chesapeake Multicultural Resource Center. Channel Marker is expanding The Primary Project for K-2 students. For All Seasons is providing training for 18 clinicians in specialized psychotherapy to treat child attachment and trauma disorders.

Reengagement Coordinator

Talbot County Public Schools

The Reengagement Coordinator outreaches to Opportunity Youth ages 16-24 who have dropped out of school within the last 7 years and offers services to reconnect them with school or work.
